If you are a student, or a non-surgical resident or a medical physician (other than a radiologist, gastroenterologist or pathologist) and wish to serve at one of these hospitals, please use the contact list below to arrange a rotation at the following hospitals. North American physicians are usually referred to World Medical Mission (http://www.samaritanspurse.org/index.php/Serving_Overseas) and it is recommended that you start there. Given the necessity of visas, inoculations and the limited housing for guests at all of these places, it is advised that you start working on arranging your rotation at least six months in advance. Please be aware that you will be responsible for ALL costs of travel to and from the country, passport, visas, inoculations, travel within the country and the housing, utilities, food and other incidental costs at the hospital. Some hospitals have minimum requirements for the length of time spent there and preferences for language ability.
